Second Reading— .Philippians Chapter 4:4-7

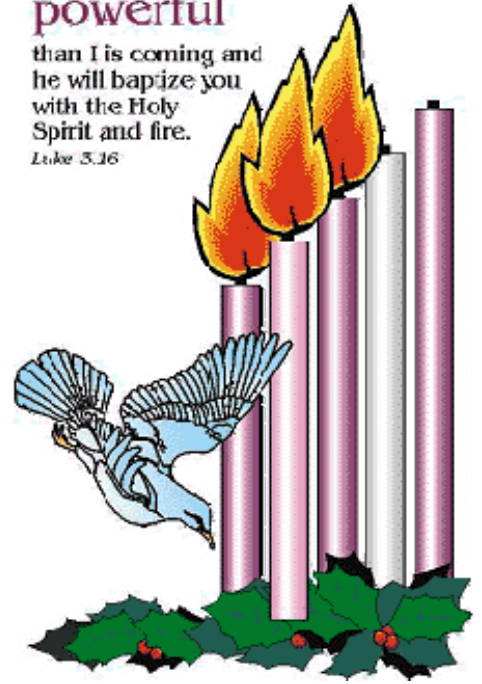
Therefore, my brothers, you whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, that is how you should stand firm in the Lord, dear friends! I plead with Euodia and I plead with Syntyche to agree with each other in the Lord. Yes, and I ask you, loyal yokefellow, help these women who have contended at my side in the cause of the gospel, along with Clement and the rest of my fellow workers, whose names are in the book of life. Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable--if anything is excellent or praiseworthy--think about such things. Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen in me--put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you. I rejoice greatly in the Lord that at last you have renewed your concern for me. Indeed, you have been concerned, but you had no opportunity to show it. I am not saying this because I am in need, for I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. I can do everything through him who gives me strength.

Gospel Reading - Luke 3: 7-18

John said to the crowds coming out to be baptized by him, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? Produce fruit in keeping with repentance. And do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' For I tell you that out of these stones God can raise up children for Abraham. The axe is already at the root of the trees, and every tree that does not produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire." "What should we do then?" the crowd asked. John answered, "The man with two tunics should share with him who has none, and the one who has food should do the same." Tax collectors also came to be baptized. "Teacher," they asked, "what should we do?" "Don't collect any more than you are required to," he told them. Then some soldiers asked him, "And what should we do?" He replied, "Don't extort money and don't accuse people falsely--be content with your pay." The people were waiting expectantly and were all wondering in their hearts if John might possibly be the Christ. John answered them all, "I baptize you with water. But one more powerful than I will come, the thongs of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but he will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire." And with many other words John exhorted the people and preached the good news to them.

Commentary

We have optimistic readings this week to encourage us with unexpected light and joy. The coming of Christ is not something to fear, but to anticipate with great delight and enthusiasm. Zephaniah's ministry was in the time of King Josiah (just over 600BC). He talks in his writings about Gods judgement on Israel, but at the end we have this call to the faithful to rejoice in Gods' victorious kingship. He alone will be king and it is stressed that it is the lame and the outcast whom he will bring in as his subjects, having ousted their oppressors. Zephaniah has been described as a "radical prophetic book" a charter for the 'little people' of all corrupt societies. The glad word to us all is, as verse 20 says, that God will gather us and bring us home. So we can rejoice! Pauls' letter to the Philippians is quite possibly in the context of trouble (nothing new there!). In our reading he is confident that, no matter what, the cure is to recall the people to the joy they knew when they first came to faith. This is what William Barclay has to say "Rejoice," says Paul. "I will say it again - Rejoice!" It is as if he said, "Rejoice!" And suddenly there flashed into his mind a picture of all that was to come. He himself was lying in prison with almost certain death awaiting him; the Philippians were setting out on the Christian way, and dark days, and dangers, and persecutions inevitable lay ahead. So Paul says, "I know what I'm saying. I've thought of everything that can possible happen. And still I say it - Rejoice!" The Christian joy is independent of all things on earth, because the Christian joy has its source in the continual presence of Christ. So we are not to worry about anything, easier said than done, but we recall

that Jesus asked “Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life? Instead of worrying, Paul says, we should pray. He stresses that we can take everything to God in prayer, for there is nothing too great for God’s power and nothing too small for his fatherly care. William Barclay suggests that when we pray we should remember the love of God that wants only the best for us; the wisdom of God that knows what is best for us; and the power of God that really can deliver! And the end result is the wonderful promise that “the peace of God that passes all understanding will guard our hearts and minds in Christ Jesus” (V7). Indeed a cause for joy. Our gospel reading has large crowds following John, asking him what to do to escape condemnation. What he tells them reflects some important ethical requirements of groups of people who were especially able to exploit others. Those who have plenty are to share, tax collectors are not to abuse their authority and soldiers are not to exploit their powers. Hints here for MP’s and bankers in our times! And there is challenge and food for thought for us all too. How, consistent, honest and compassionate are we in our dealings with other people? And what of our instant judgements of others? Do our lives bear testimony to the love and grace of God? John says that he is not the Messiah. He points to one whose shoes he is not even fit to lace up—one far greater than himself. Jesus who comes in light and love “Joy to the world” indeed. Good news of great joy for you, for me, for all our loved ones and all humankind. *Richard Ledger*

With this Christingle, a symbol of God’s love for us, we will remember and pray for children who have little light in their lives: children who are runaways, trying to escape from conflict at home, children who have become refugees, seeking safety but meeting with prejudice; children who are bullied, but teased, often for no reason at all. Loving God, source of all light, help us to shine your light into their darkness, so that they may see a future and have hope. Amen (*Prayer of the Children’s Society*)
