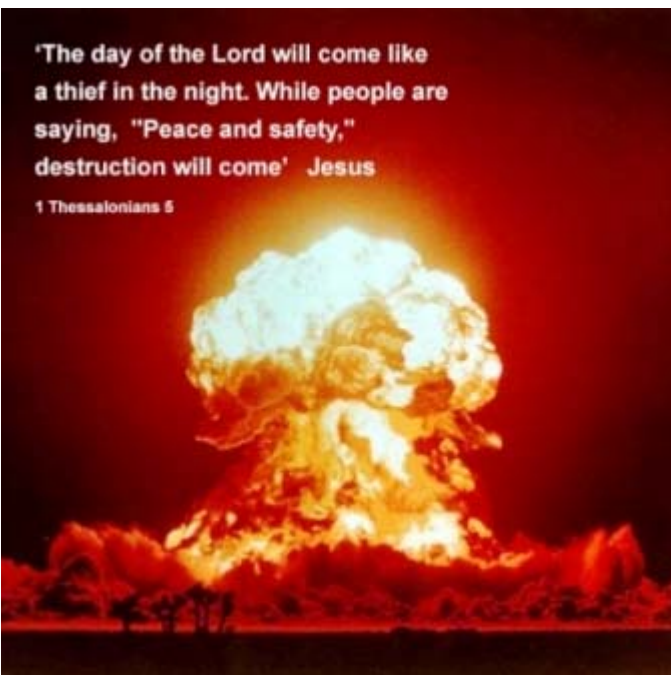

First Bible Reading - Judges 4: 1-7

After Ehud died, the Israelites once again did evil in the eyes of the LORD. So the LORD sold them into the hands of Jabin, a king of Canaan, who reigned in Hazor. The commander of his army was Sisera, who lived in Harosheth Haggoyim. Because he had nine hundred iron chariots and had cruelly oppressed the Israelites for twenty years, they cried to the LORD for help. Deborah, a prophetess, the wife of Lappidoth, was leading Israel at that time. She held court under the Palm of Deborah between Ramah and Bethel in the hill country of Ephraim, and the Israelites came to her to have their disputes decided. She sent for Barak son of Abinoam from Kedesh in Naphtali and said to him, "The LORD, the God of Israel, commands you: 'Go, take with you ten thousand men of Naphtali and Zebulun and lead the way to Mount Tabor. I will lure Sisera, the commander of Jabin's army, with his chariots and his troops to the Kishon River and give him into your hands.' (Reader: This is the word of the Lord – Thanks be to God)

Second Reading- 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11

Now, brothers, about times and dates we do not need to write to you, for you know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. While people are saying, "Peace and safety," destruction will come on them suddenly, as labour pains on a pregnant woman, and they will not escape. But you, brothers, are not in darkness so that this day should surprise you like a thief. You are all sons of the light and sons of the day. We do not belong to the night or to the darkness. So then, let us not be like others, who are asleep, but let us be alert and self-controlled. For those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk, get drunk at night. But since we belong to the day, let us be self-controlled, putting on faith and love as a breastplate, and the hope of salvation as a helmet. For God did not appoint us to suffer wrath but to receive salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ. He died for us so that, whether we are awake or asleep, we may live together with him. Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing. (Reader: This is the word of the Lord -- **Thanks be to God**)

Gospel Reading - Matthew 25: 14-30 All: Glory to Christ our Saviour

"Again, it will be like a man going on a journey, who called his servants and entrusted his property to them. To one he gave five talents^[a] of money, to another two talents, and to another one talent, each according to his ability. Then he went on his journey. The man who had received the five talents went at once and put his money to work and gained five more. So also, the one

with the two talents gained two more. But the man who had received the one talent went off, dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money.

"After a long time the master of those servants returned and settled accounts with them. The man who had received the five talents brought the other five. 'Master,' he said, 'you entrusted me with five talents. See, I have gained five more.'

"His master replied, 'Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master's happiness!'

"The man with the two talents also came. 'Master,' he said, 'you entrusted me with two talents; see, I have gained two more.' "His master replied, 'Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master's happiness!' "Then the man who had received the one talent came. 'Master,' he said, 'I knew that you are a hard man, harvesting where you have not sown and gathering where you have not scattered seed. So I was afraid and went out and hid your talent in the ground. See, here is what belongs to you.' "His master replied, 'You wicked, lazy servant! So you knew that I harvest where I have not sown and gather where I have not scattered seed? Well then, you should have put my money on deposit with the bankers, so that when I returned I would have received it back with interest. " 'Take the talent from him and give it to the one who has the ten talents. For everyone who has will be given more, and he will have an abundance. Whoever does not have, even what he has will be taken from him. And throw that worthless servant outside, into the darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'

(Reader: This is the Gospel of Christ - **Praise to Christ our Lord**)

Commentary

Today's Gospel reading is the last but one from the Gospel of Matthew that we will read in this Lectionary Year and the last in a series where Jesus has tried to explain the meaning of the 'Kingdom of Heaven'. Unlike some of his parables Jesus does not tell the story then explain it, which is a pity considering that some of the content of the parable may be open to misinterpretation. The story describes how three servants each entrusted with varying, but substantial amounts, of their master's wealth while he went on a long journey responded to their responsibility in differing ways. A 'talent' was a very large sum of money, equivalent to several thousand pounds not, as we might at first think, an artistic or creative gift. Note in verse 15 that each were given 'according to their ability', so their master had judged what they were capable of and expected them to rise to that capability.

Two of the servants responded quickly and well by putting the money to work and doubled the amounts they had been given, 5 talents grew to 10 and 2 to 4. Whereas the third servant took no chances and buried his money, the analogy today might be investing in shares (pre the recent market crash) and putting it under the mattress. While burying money in the ground might seem odd to us it may not have been so odd in Israel at that time. In Matthew 13 v 44 another parable about the Kingdom of Heaven begins 'The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field'. When telling parables Jesus used situations that were familiar to his hearers so we can assume that is what people sometimes did with their valuables. Such a place may have been secure but the contents had no chance of expanding. Do we sometimes bury 'our treasure' our knowledge and experience of God the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit and not seek to share it with others and stunt its growth in our own lives and those of others?

The third servant, when presumably fully aware of his colleague's financial gains and his master's praise of them, made his excuses by casting doubt on his master's motives and morals and making out he was afraid of his master. When I was younger I feel fairly sure that there was more of an emphasis on 'the fear of the Lord', not helped by the expression 'to put the fear of God into you'. This I took literally that is was right to be afraid of God, but as I grew in my knowledge of God I learnt that the 'fear' of God and being afraid are not the same. No space here to dwell on that thought further, perhaps another day. The servant was in fact projecting his own behaviour on to that of his master accusing him of not investing in his servants when he clearly had. We too may find ourselves projecting our behaviour on to others and misjudging their motives. When we project our own human frailties on to God's character we can so easily distort his expectation of us and bury the gifts that he entrusts us to use in his service. So much better when we step out in faith as God expects with the promise when we do of 'sharing in his happiness'.

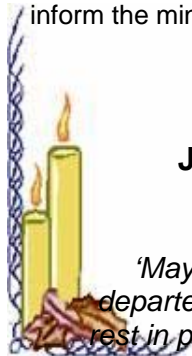
