First Reading - Acts 9: 1-6

Meanwhile, Saul was still breathing out murderous threats against the Lord's disciples. He went to the high priest and asked him for letters to the synagogues in Damascus, so that if he found any there who belonged to the Way, whether men or women, he might take them as prisoners to Jerusalem. As he neared Damascus on his journey, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. He fell to the ground and heard a voice say to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" "Who are you, Lord?" Saul asked. "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting," he replied. "Now get up and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do."

(Reader: This is the Word of the Lord. All: Thanks be to God)

Second Reading – Rev 5: 11-14

Then I looked and heard the voice of many angels, numbering thousands upon thousands, and ten thousand times ten thousand. They encircled the throne and the living creatures and the elders. In a loud voice they sang: "Worthy is the Lamb, who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and strength and honour and glory and praise!" Then I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and on the sea, and all that is in them, singing: "To him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be praise and honour and glory and power, for ever and ever!" The four living creatures said, "Amen," and the elders fell down and worshipped (Reader: This is the Word of the Lord. **All: Thanks be to God)**

Gospel Reading – John 21: 1-19

Afterward Jesus appeared again to his disciples, by the Sea of Tiberias. It happened this way: Simon Peter, Thomas (called Didymus), Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two other disciples were together. "I'm going out to fish," Simon Peter told them, and they said, "We'll go with you." So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. Early in the morning, Jesus stood on the shore, but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus. He called out to them, "Friends, haven't you any fish?" "No," they answered. He said, "Throw your net on the right side of the boat and you will find some." When they did, they were unable to haul the net in because of the large number of fish. Then the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" As soon as Simon Peter heard him say, "It is the Lord," he wrapped his outer garment around him (for he had taken it off) and jumped into the water. The other disciples followed in the boat, towing the net full of fish, for they were not far from shore, about a hundred yards. When they landed, they saw a fire of burning coals there with fish on it, and some bread.

Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish you have just caught." Simon Peter climbed aboard and dragged the net ashore. It was full of large fish, 153, but even with so many the net was not

torn. Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." None of the disciples dared ask him, "Who are you?" They knew it was the Lord. Jesus came, took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. This was now the third time Jesus appeared to his disciples after he was raised from the dead. When they had finished eating, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you truly love me more than these?" "Yes, Lord," he said, "you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Feed my lambs." Again Jesus said, "Simon son of John, do you truly love me?" He answered, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Take care of my sheep." The third time he said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter was hurt because Jesus asked him the third time, "Do you love me?" He said, "Lord, you know all things; you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Feed my sheep. I tell you the truth, when you were younger you dressed yourself and went where you wanted; but when you are old you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go." Jesus said this to indicate the kind of death by which Peter would glorify God. Then he said to him, "Follow me!"

Commentary

We are in dramatic times in the Church's year and our readings from Scripture. We are still celebrating the dramatic events of Christ's Resurrection and our readings describe dramatic experiences of the first disciples that followed that first Easter day. The message I got from the passages was this: Jesus Calls; Jesus Converts; Jesus Commands and Jesus Cares. Thinking about the first JC in my list:

'Jesus Calls' if we look first at who 'Jesus Calls' we might see that there is a vast contrast between those he called: Saul, a Roman citizen born in Tarsus, a member of a synagogue council, became a fanatical persecutor of Christians, today we might call him an extremist or fundamentalist. After he had witnessed the stoning of Stephen in Jerusalem he travelled around armed with letters of authority, that he had got from high priests, to seek out those Christians who, to avoid persecution, had dispersed to other places, such as Damascus. By all accounts although he was probably very intelligent and well educated his personal appearance was not very impressive. In today's society where we often judge by appearances, where even our potential prime ministers can be win votes based on what they look like, Saul would not be an obvious choice to be converted to Christianity. But thankfully God does not judge us by our appearances, and Jesus warned against those who outwardly portrayed a pious persona. God gave Saul, who we know as Paul a second chance, he called him away from persecution of Christians to be their most ardent teacher.

In contrast to Paul is Peter, impetuous Peter, who early in his ministry Jesus had called away from being a simple fisherman to become one of his valued followers and close friend. However it seems that after Jesus' resurrection Peter and 6 other disciples had gone back to the way of life they knew before Jesus first called them. It is not unnatural to rely on the familiar when we have gone through a dramatic and traumatic time. But Jesus did not give up on those he called then and he does not give up on us now! Like Paul he gave Peter a second chance, a second chance calling him to not just follow in his footsteps but to become the leader of all his followers!

Once Jesus has called he then 'Converts' my second 'JC'. But like the diversity of those he calls the nature of their conversion is diverse too. Paul, was dramatically converted after being blinded by a 'light from heaven', falling to the ground and hearing Jesus ask him: 'Saul, Saul why do you persecute me?' Interestingly Paul seemed to recognise the voice of God replying 'Who are you Lord,?'. He was then blind

and fasted for three days before he was able to understand the difference between the God of awe and the God of love as seen in Jesus. Further on in Acts 9 verses 7 to 19, we learn that God used Ananias to bring Paul out of his old ways as persecutor into the fold of his followers. Ananias was at first reluctant because he knew Paul's reputation and feared him but God commanded him to 'Go' so he did.

Peter's conversion was different, still dramatic, but different. Jesus uses methods that he had used many times before when trying to reach and teach people about him and his Heavenly Father. He went to where Peter was, to the lakeside where he had spent many hours with Peter and his other disciples before his crucifixion. He used a 'miracle', the miraculous catch of fish. The disciples, who were experienced fishermen, had failed to make a catch despite fishing all night. Then Jesus appears and tells them to cast the net on the other side which they do resulting in haul of such a large number of fish that the net was expected to tear under the weight. Then he used another tried and tested method, that of sharing a meal with them, the equivalent of what we would call a barbecue! I wonder if the



fish they ate was what is now called 'Peter's fish' because it is only found in the Sea of Galilee? It is a large and quite ugly fish, with tender but not a great deal of flesh on it.

These methods Jesus used to convert Peter, to change him from simple fisherman to the great orator and leader we read about later in Acts, are methods that we too can use to bring people to know, love and follow Jesus. Firstly to go to where they are, not expect them to come to us, or to provide and environment in which people can feel comfortable, can feel familiar and relaxed. Secondly we may not be able to perform miracles, but we can tell people about when Jesus has made a difference in our lives or in the lives of those we know or love. Thirdly we can and do use meals to bring people together, but can we expand this ministry? Can we expand it to make people feel welcomed into the church fellowship?

Once Jesus called Paul and Peter he 'commanded them', my third 'JC'. Paul's ministry took him on many travels and focused mainly on conversion of Gentiles, proclaiming as written in his letter to the Galatians chapter 3 verse 28 'There is neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free, male nor female, for you are all one in Christ'. Whereas Peter concentrated changing the hearts and minds of fellow Jews in Jerusalem. Jesus' command to Peter was preceded by what could have been quite a humiliating experience for Peter. Jesus ask' him three times if he still loves him each time Peter protests 'you know I love you!'. But during this dialogue we hear Jesus' profound command to Peter to 'Feed my lambs' and 'Feed my sheep'. Peter the fisherman is to change role to Peter the shepherd. To literally take over Jesus' role a Shepherd of the new flock he had formed to follow in the new way, the way of the cross. I was very taken by the stylish but powerful sculpture of these commands, which is situated by the Sea of Galilee at the site where it is believed Jesus gave his command to Peter, which is printed in this Partnership News.

Finally my last JC 'Jesus Cares'. Throughout his ministry Jesus showed that he cared. He cared for the hungry, the sick, the poor, the dying, the marginalised, the stranger, and even at his own point of death he cared for his mother and the criminal. Then central to his commands to Peter is the one to 'Take care of my sheep'. His command to us is just as central, as Christians as part of Christ's flock we are commanded to care. Commanded to care, not just for those within our existing fellowship, but beyond to those lambs and sheep who Jesus may be calling but who have not yet recognised him as 'Lord' like Peter and Paul. *Wendy Waters*
