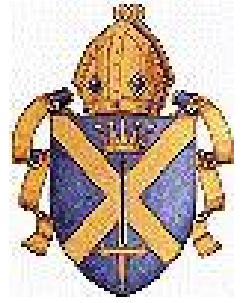

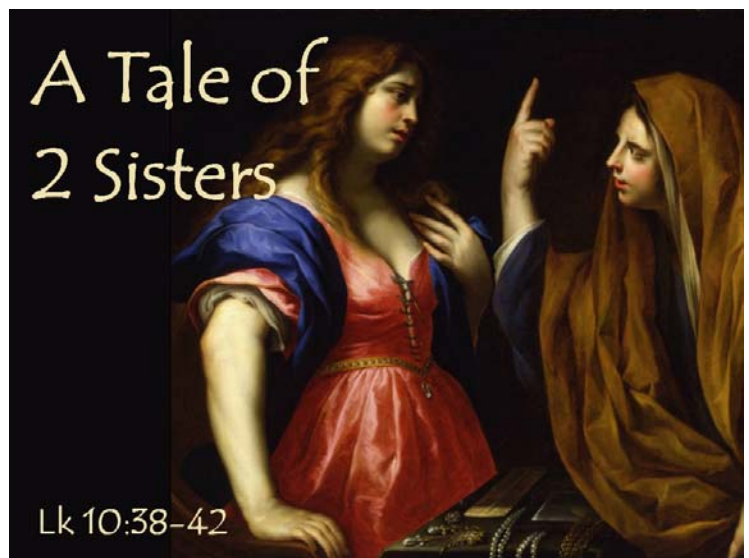
Opening Sentence from Scripture

Psalm 29:2

Old Testament Reading - Genesis 18: 1-10a

The LORD appeared to Abraham near the great trees of Mamre while he was sitting at the entrance to his tent in the heat of the day. Abraham looked up and saw three men standing nearby. When he saw them, he hurried from the entrance of his tent to meet them and bowed low to the ground. He said, "If I have found favor in your eyes, my lord, do not pass your servant by. Let a little water be brought, and then you may all wash your feet and rest under this tree. Let me get you something to eat, so you can be refreshed and then go on your way--now that you have come to your servant." "Very well," they answered, "do as you say." So Abraham hurried into the tent to Sarah. "Quick," he said, "get three seahs of fine flour and knead it and bake some bread." Then he ran to the herd and selected a choice, tender calf and gave it to a servant, who hurried to prepare it. He then brought some curds and milk and the calf that had been prepared, and set these before them. While they ate, he stood near them under a tree. "Where is your wife Sarah?" they asked him. "There, in the tent," he said. Then the LORD said, "I will surely return to you about this time next year, and Sarah your wife will have a son."

Epistle Reading -Col: 15-28

He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. For by him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things were created by him and for him. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. And he is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so that in everything he might have the supremacy. For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross.

Once you were alienated from God and were enemies in your minds because of your evil behaviour. But now he has reconciled you by Christ's physical body through death to present you holy in his sight, without blemish and free from accusation-- if you continue in your faith, established and firm, not moved from the hope held out in the gospel. This is the gospel that you heard and that has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven, and of which I, Paul, have become a servant. Now I rejoice in what was suffered for you, and I fill up in my flesh what is still lacking in regard to Christ's afflictions, for the sake of his body, which is the church. I have become its servant by the commission God gave me to present to you the word of God in its fullness-- the mystery that has been kept hidden for ages and generations, but is now disclosed to the saints. To them God has chosen to make known among the Gentiles the glorious riches of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. We proclaim him, admonishing and teaching everyone with all wisdom, so that we may present everyone perfect in Christ. To this end I labour, struggling with all his energy, which so powerfully works in me

Commentary



This Icon, painted by St Andrey Rublev sometime between 1408 and 1425), is often interpreted as representing the Trinity; God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. The three figures are linked together by their eyes each looking at the one next to them. I had accepted and found helpful this visual image of the Trinity, it being a very difficult concept to explain. Some years ago I discovered that the Orthodox Church's understanding of this icon is that it depicts today's OT reading from Genesis 18: 1 – 10a. The three figures are the three visitors to whom Abraham extended generous and warm hospitality. Offering such hospitality to strangers was, and I believe still is, common practise in eastern countries. The writer to the Hebrews commends this depth of hospitality to its readers in Chapter 13:2 'Do not forget to entertain strangers, for by doing so some people have entertained angels without knowing it'. By commending this to the Hebrews it is expected that all

God's people should act similarly. Martha in Luke Chapter 10 verses 38 – 42 is therefore following in a long held tradition of caring for visitors, both strangers and friends. What Martha.

Without Martha's doing, without her preparations, the hospitality that she gave to Jesus and his disciples would not have happened. What Martha did wrong was to fret about all she had to do, suggesting that at that point she had not heard Jesus' teaching, recorded later in Luke 12 verses 22 – 3, which begins: 'Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat; or your body, what you will wear ...'.

Martha's visitors were Jesus and his friends. The Icon depicts Abraham's visitors as angels. In the Bible Angels are usually taken for men until their words or deeds prove them otherwise. Abraham, in verse 3, seems to believe that one of them was 'The Lord' when in verse he says 'If I have found favour in your eyes, my lord, do not pass your servant by'. This is substantiated in verses 10 and 13 which begin 'Then the Lord said..'

So let us all be mindful, as we reach out to other's in whatever way is appropriate to us and our situation, to be alert to the fact that we 'may be entertaining angels'. And remember that Jesus teaches us, in Mathew 25 verse 35, that each time we invite a stranger in we in fact invite him in.

Meditation Martha

"So this is Martha." You say to yourself, the housewife who got into a right state over entertaining a few guests and lost patience with her sister when she failed to give a hand. No, no excuses, you may feel sympathy for me, many do, but the image remains, a woman who couldn't see beyond her immediate domestic concerns. I was busy that day, of course I was, but I was used to managing and had help enough. No, I was concerned for Mary; I loved her dearly, but she had no sense of what is proper. Don't you understand? She shouldn't have been sitting there with the men, it could easily set tongues wagging.

A man's world is different, starting from synagogue; we have our separate places, our separate functions;

She was where she had no right to be - or so I thought. Well, the Lord saw it differently, and who am I to quarrel with him? But I do sometimes wonder where it will all end.

Jesus has chosen a most unlikely teacher for us, a lowly woman -- not a respected Pharisee or lawyer, not an authoritative expert or a great prophet--a woman, to teach us that hearing and doing go together. The point of the story, is that it's not hearing OR doing, but it's hearing AND doing the Word of God that makes us faithful disciples. If we are so busy with our "doing" that we can't stop, regularly and long enough, to listen for God, well, then our lives, as Henri Nouwen says, will remain full, but unfulfilled.

Church of England votes for women bishops

The Church of England has this last week started upon a process which will allow women to become bishops. Believe it or not it has taken all this time for the church to give equal right to women! When we begin to look at women in the New Testament, the first thing we observe is how Jesus spent time with women and apparently enjoyed their companionship--in stark contrast to other men of His day. In the midst of the Greek, Roman and Jewish cultures, which viewed women almost on the level with possessions, Jesus showed love and respect for women. Though Jewish rabbis did not teach women, Jesus not only included women in His audiences but used illustrations and images in His teaching which would be familiar to them (Matt. 13:33, 22:1-2; 24:41; Lk. 15:8-10). He also specifically applied His teachings to women (Matt. 10:34f).

While the Jewish Talmud said it was better to burn the Torah than teach it to a woman, Jesus taught women freely. To the Samaritan woman at the well (Jn. 4), He revealed that He was the Messiah. With her He also discussed such important topics as eternal life and the nature of true worship. Jesus never took the position that women, by their very nature, could not understand spiritual or theological truth. He also taught Mary and, when admonished by Martha, pointed out the priority of learning spiritual truth even over "womanly" responsibilities like serving guests in one's home (Lk. 10:38-42).

Though men in Jesus' day normally would not allow women to count change into their hands for fear of physical contact, Jesus touched women to heal them and allowed women to touch Him (Lk. 13:10f; Mk. 5:25f). Jesus even allowed a small group of women to travel with Him and His disciples (Lk. 8:1-3)--"an unprecedented happening in the history of that time," said one commentator.

After His resurrection, Jesus appeared first to Mary Magdalene and sent her to announce His resurrection to the disciples (Jn. 20:1-18). Jesus did this despite the fact that women were not allowed to be witnesses in Jewish courts because women were called liars, incapable of truth!

In Jesus' treatment of women we see how He raised their station in life and how He showed them compassion and respect in a way that they had never known before. The Church of England has finally caught up with Jesus. *Charles Royden*

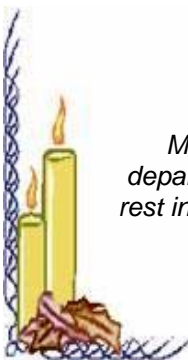
