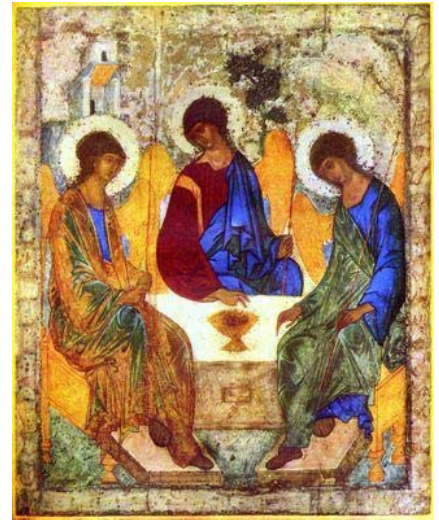
Trinity Sunday

Introduction

Listen to some people talk about God and you might be excused for thinking that they had just met him on the bus. They seem to know everything and you might think that you are really stupid. Well take comfort from the opening scripture in our bible notes today from Isaiah Chapter 40

'His understanding no one can fathom.'

When it comes to God we have not even begun to scratch the surface. God is so much beyond our human reasoning that it is only the arrogant and the stupid who claim to have all the answers. Perhaps nowhere is this more true than in the Christian belief in the Trinity. The Sunday after Pentecost is always a special day dedicated as Trinity Sunday. It is special because for once we are not looking back to a specific occasion, or remembering an event, instead we are celebrating who God is - Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Trinity Sunday is a day on which we can focus on the extraordinary truth that God is three persons and yet still one. This wonderful truth about Trinity Sunday reminds us that God is above and beyond our attempts to explain or understand. Our rational human explanations for God collapse when we are confronted by the truth that that God is three and God is one. Nobody can ever understand God, God is a profound mystery and all human reasoning will always fail to encompass the glory of God. So we can stop worrying about our own lack of understanding and instead worship God the Father who showed his love for us in Jesus and lives in us today by the presence of the Holy Spirit



Early theologians used the word *perichoresis*, which literally means "dancing around" to express the ever vital, ever moving, ever interweaving of Father, Son, and Holy Ghost

Opening Verse of Scripture Corinthians Chapter 13:12--13

Now we see but a poor reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known. And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.

Collect Prayer (Before we read we pray)

Almighty and everlasting God, you have given us your servants grace, by the confession of a true faith, to acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity and in the power of the divine majesty to worship the Unity: keep us steadfast in this faith, that we may evermore be defended from all adversities; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen. *Common Worship*

First Bible Reading – Isaiah 40: 12-17, 27-end

Who has measured the waters in the hollow of his hand, or with the breadth of his hand marked off the heavens? Who has held the dust of the earth in a basket, or weighed the mountains on the scales and the hills in a balance? Who can fathom the Spirit of the LORD, or instruct the LORD as his counsellor? Whom did the LORD consult to enlighten him, and who taught him the right way? Who was it that taught him knowledge, or showed him the path of understanding? Surely the nations are like a drop in a bucket; they are regarded as dust on the scales; he weighs the islands as though they were fine dust. Lebanon is not sufficient for altar fires, nor its animals enough for burnt offerings. Before him all the nations are as nothing; they are regarded by him as worthless and less than nothing. Why do you complain, Jacob? Why do you say, Israel, "My way is hidden from the LORD; my cause is disregarded by my God"? Do you not know? Have you not heard? The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He will not grow tired or weary, and his understanding no one can fathom. He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall; but those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint.

(This is the Word of the Lord — **Thanks be to God**)

Second Reading - 2 Corinthians Chapter 13:11-14

Finally, brothers, good-bye. Aim for perfection, listen to my appeal, be of one mind, live in peace. And the God of love and peace will be with you. Greet one another with a holy kiss. All the saints send their greetings. May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

(This is the Word of the Lord — **Thanks be to God**)

Gospel Reading - Matthew 28:16-20

(When the gospel is announced **All: Glory to God our Saviour**)

Then the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

(This is the gospel of Christ. - **Praise to Christ our Lord**)

Commentary

The Trinity seems to be one of the subjects that causes more debate among theologians than any other topic. An article in this week's Church Times which reviews three new books on the topic has the title, 'Three in One, One in Three, Theologians are still wrestling with this'. Is God one being with three facets or is He three components comprising one whole? Does it matter? Another article in the same edition of the paper starts off with the statement, 'Preachers are nervous on Trinity Sunday. This is not so much because of harbouring doubts about the doctrine of the Trinity... ..it is more because of having to check the complicated history of the fundamental expression of our faith'. For Christians the Trinity does matter, because how we understand the Trinity affects the way we look at our lives and our relationship with God, and makes a major difference as to how we look at ourselves as the corporate body of God on earth. Since the middle ages Trinity Sunday has been observed as a separate feast in honour of the Trinity but debates about the nature of the Trinity have gone on for many years before that, because the Trinity is so central to what we believe and who we are. Neither is the Trinity just a New Testament concept as we've seen in the Rublev icon. When God created the world back in Genesis it was a plural God that did so. When Abraham had the three visitors, as the Rublev icon demonstrates, it's often interpreted as a visitation from the Trinity, the Triune God. Tertullian, an early theologian around 200 AD, postulated that the Old Testament was the time of God the Father, the New Testament was the time of God the Son, and we are now living in the time of God the Holy Spirit, a model known as the economic Trinity. One God, three persons, three phases of dealing with the world. This is an unsatisfactory view because it ties the Trinity to a time and space framework and can present God as appearing in three different modes which is not helpful, nor correct. However, it is still a view that some have today. Augustine modified this and for him the primordial God was the Trinity and the three persons of the trinity exist in relationship to each other as the lover, the beloved and the love which flows between them. This is the view we still predominantly have today in the western churches. In the 20th century it was developed by one of the great theologians, Karl Barth, who expressed the Trinity as 'a revealer', 'the thing revealed', and 'the revelation'. However we try to conceptualise the Trinity it will remain a complex topic and one which will continue to keep theologians busy for years!

Trinity Sunday marks the end of two periods each of three festivals. We have Advent, Christmas and Epiphany followed by Lent, Easter and Pentecost each of which could be seen to embody the triune nature of God in themselves. From next week we move into Ordinary time when we look to live out the reality of the Trinity which has been present through the seasons from Advent in our lives. Like Augustine and many theologians even today we may not be able to understand fully the Trinity we do live in its reality. Our God is a triune God, and we are created in His image. So whatever we make of the Trinity, as John Wesley wrote, Let us adore the Father, the God of love; who created us; who continually preserves and sustains us; who has loved us with an everlasting love and given us the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. Though He was rich, yet for our sakes, He became poor; He was tempted at all points as we are, yet without sin; He became obedient to death, death on a cross; He was dead and is alive for ever; He has opened the Kingdom of heaven to all who trust in Him. Let us rejoice in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life; by whom were born into the family of God; whose witness confirms us, whose wisdom teaches us; whose power enables us. All praise to you, Holy Trinity, for you live and reign, one God for ever and ever. Amen. *Sam*

Meditation

Many people think that the Icon of the Trinity painted by Rublev, similar images of which date from the 5th century, is one of the greatest ever created. This Rublev icon was painted by a Russian monk called Andrew Rublev in the fifteenth century, hence its name. Interpretations of this icon vary but importantly Rublev's icon shows a single small tree in the background, to represent the oaks of Mamre where Abraham's encounter with the Trinity took place. It therefore places this as an Old Testament image of the Trinity. However, on the left of the icon is an architectural structure to represent the Basilica that Constantine erected as one of the first four Christian churches to be built in Palestine, which also places the icon in a New Testament context. The chalice on the table contains not wine but a small calf, mirroring the offering that Abraham brought for the 'angels' to eat, and symbolising too the reality of what we drink at communion represents the Christ who offered Himself as a sacrifice for us. The central angel is wearing a purple Imperial robe, suggesting that He represents Christ Himself. He sits on the right hand of the Father, so the angel on the right of the picture could represent the Father, wearing as He does a green cloak, perhaps representing creation. On the left is an angel wearing a blue robe covered with a pink cloak, suggestive of the Spirit. Together they represent the circular image of the unity of the Trinity. It is sometimes said that as we place ourselves in front of icons such as this is prayer, we both have a window which helps us see God and also experience a gentle invitation to participate with God in His world and to enter into communion with Him. In the case of the Rublev icon, we're invited to join in the intimate conversation that is taking place among the three divine angels and to join them around the table in the Eucharistic celebration to which we are all invited. It is said that not only do we see God through the window and image of icons, but God also sees us through these images. If that is so, how does God see us through the 'icons' we have in our own lives and the windows, images and lenses through which we see God.

Prayers for Sunday and the week ahead

We bind unto ourselves the name, the strong name of the Trinity, by invocation of the same, the three in one and one in three, of whom all nature has creation, eternal Father, Spirit, Word; praise to the God of our salvation; salvation is of Christ the Lord. **Amen** *St Patrick*

Phos Hilaron: Now as the sun sets in the west, soft lamplight glows as evening starts; thus light from light, God's Son all blest comes from the immortal Father's heart; we therefore sing our joyful songs to the Father, Holy Spirit, Son, to whom in every age belongs by right all praise from every tongue. Lord Jesus, Son of God, from you all life, all joy come forth this night; the world, and each soft glowing hue, reflect the glory from your light. Praise be to the Holy Trinity for ever and ever and to the ages of ages. **Amen**
O Lord, whose way is perfect, help us always to trust in your goodness, to walk in the way of faith, and to follow in the path of simplicity. Teach us to cast our cares on your providence, that we may possess a quiet mind and a contented spirit; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

Holy and blessed Trinity, between you there is mutual respect and care. Hold in your triune grasp all who look for wholeness to be restored and in all our sufferings deepen our hope in you. **Amen**

God the Holy Trinity make you strong in faith and love, defend you on every side, and guide you in truth and peace; and may the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, be among you and remain with you always. **Amen**

It is hoped that keeping Clubhouse operational every Wednesday will allow us a period of time for transition for people to sort out their funding, but only until 1 October 2011.
