Sunday before Advent Stir-up-Sunday



Verse of Scripture - Romans Chapter 13:11

Now is the time to wake out of sleep: for now our salvation is nearer than when we first believed.

Collect Prayer - Before we read we pray

God the Father, help us to hear the call of Christ the King and to follow in his service, whose kingdom has no end; for he reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

Common Worship Shorter Collect

First Bible Reading - Daniel 7: 9-10, 13-14

"As I looked, "thrones were set in place, and the Ancient of Days took his seat. His clothing was as white as snow; the hair of his head was white like wool. His throne was flaming with fire, and its wheels were all ablaze. A river of fire was flowing, coming out from before him. Thousands upon thousands attended him; ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him. The court was seated, and the books were opened. "In my vision at night I looked, and there before me was one like a son of man, coming with the clouds of heaven. He approached the Ancient of Days and was led into his presence. He was given authority, glory and sovereign power; all peoples, nations and men of every language worshiped him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that will not pass away, and his kingdom is one that will never be destroyed.

(Reader: This is the word of the Lord. **All: Thanks be to God**)

Second Reading - Revelation 1: 4b-8

John, To the seven churches in the province of Asia: Grace and peace to you from him who is, and who was, and who is to come, and from the seven spirits before his throne, and from Jesus Christ, who is the faithful witness, the firstborn from the dead, and the ruler of the kings of the earth. To him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood, and has made us to be a kingdom and priests to serve his God and Father--to him be glory and power for ever and ever! Amen. Look, he is coming with the clouds, and every eye will see him, even those who pierced him; and all the peoples of the earth will mourn because of him. So shall it be! Amen. "I am the Alpha and the Omega," says the Lord God, "who is, and who was, and who is to come, the Almighty."

(This is the word of the Lord - **All: Thanks be to God**)

Third Reading - John 18: 33-37

Pilate then went back inside the palace, summoned Jesus and asked him, "Are you the king of the Jews?" "Is that your own idea," Jesus asked, "or did others talk to you about me?" "Am I a Jew?" Pilate replied. "It was your people and your chief priests who handed you over to me. What is it you have done?" Jesus said, "My kingdom is not of this world. If it were, my servants would fight to prevent my arrest by the Jews. But now my kingdom is from another place." "You are a king, then!" said Pilate. Jesus answered, "You are right in saying I am a king. In fact, for this reason I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone on the side of truth listens to me."

Commentary Jesus the Name High Over all

This year as we will travel through the four Sundays of Advent, leading to Christmas Day, we will think of names or titles given to speak of Jesus and who he is. Each week we will consider a different name using a piece from scripture, a commentary and a prayer. There will be words spoken by the worship leader and words which the congregation can join in saying. As we do so we remind ourselves of Jesus, God born man. Jesus the name above all names.

First Candle - Jesus the Son of David the Old Testament Ancestors of Jesus

Commentary

The Old Testament spoke of the coming of the Messiah, of how a Saviour would be born, a king in the line of King David. He would rule the world wisely and bless all the nations. So the angel visited the shepherds and told them that in the Bethlehem, the City of David, a Savior had been born; Christ the Lord. God keeps his promises and Jesus the Son of David came, not just an earthly king, but the promised Saviour.

Second Candle - Jesus the Prince of Peace The prophets who foretold the birth of Jesus

Commentary

When Jesus came he taught people the importance of being peace-makers. He said that those who make peace shall be called the children of God. When Christ comes to us he brings us peace and he will bring everlasting peace when he comes again in glory.

Third Candle - Jesus the Lamb of God John The Baptist

Commentary

In their old age God gave to Zechariah and Elizabeth a son called John. When John called Jesus 'The Lamb of God,' he brought to mind the greatest act of salvation in the history of the Jewish people, the release of the people from captivity in Egypt. This was celebrated every year in Passover. Jesus was led like a lamb to the slaughter, he is our Passover lamb, sacrificed for us, once for all. We have been redeemed by the precious blood of Jesus. When John called Jesus the Lamb of God, he saw him as a Saviour who would take away the sin of the world. As we light this candle we remind ourselves that Jesus is God's final sacrifice for the sins of the world.

Fourth Candle - Jesus The Son of God Mary the Mother of Jesus

Commentary

The title Son of God expresses the unique and special relationship which Jesus has with God the Father. So Jesus called God 'Abba,' Father, and even at the age of 12 he regarded the Temple as his 'Father's House.' Son of God is a title used in key places in the Gospels. At baptism the voice of God was heard to call Jesus, God's Son. At the transfiguration the voice of God acknowledged Jesus and the way of suffering he had chosen. It is because Jesus is the Son of God that when we look at the life and teachings of Jesus we gain the very best picture of what God is really like.

The Fifth and Last Candle - Jesus is Immanuel 'God with us'

Jesus is born on Christmas Day

Commentary

God had come close to people throughout history, through prophets and priests. Now Matthew quotes the words of the prophet Isaiah to tell us that Jesus was no mere prophet, in Jesus God had actually come to dwell with the people. Jesus was not a messenger sent from God, now God had come in person. The Gospel of Matthew begins by reminding us God come to us in this unique and special way as Jesus Immanuel. The Gospel of Matthew closes by reminding us that Jesus is still among us today and he will continue to be 'until the end of the age.'

Prayer

Thank you Lord Jesus that you are to us an ever present friend. You were of one being with the father, and yet you left the throne of heaven to live among us as a servant king. You suffered death and poured out your love as you died on the cross. You brought peace to us and you set before us an example of humility, obedience and love. So may we be drawn to serve you and bring glory to your name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Meditation

Strangely, today is the last Sunday of the church year, which begins with the first Sunday in Advent, four Sundays before Christmas. Our collect today reminds us that it is 'Stir Up Sunday' a Sunday synonymous with Christmas puddings. The great cry 'stir up' was a reminder to congregations to get the Christmas pudding made in plenty of time to mature before Christmas. An important addition to the mixture is a coin, whoever gets it on their plate on Christmas Day should get worldly riches heaped upon them !

However, the prayer is actually asking God for something much more important. We are praying that God will stir up our wills, so that we might get on with doing the good works that he has planned for us to do. Then, as a consequence, we pray that we might receive our abundant reward. In an age when so much is about how we feel, it is interesting to get another perspective. In the end, it is our will, rather than our feelings, that is the most important governor of our actions.

Real love is not about feeling, it is about choosing, by our wills, to do good to others even though we may not feel good towards them. Our feelings should not dominate our wills. And so we pray that God will "stir up" our wills, so that they will be in charge of us, doing what we know is right. In this prayer we recognise that we need God's help in order for our wills to function properly. *Charles Royden*

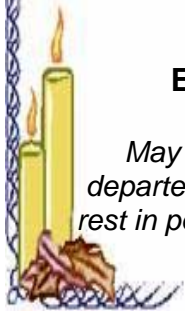
