Men will faint from terror, apprehensive of what is coming on the world, for the heavenly bodies will be shaken. At that time they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. When these things begin to take place, stand up and lift up your heads, because your redemption is drawing near." He told them this parable: "Look at the fig tree and all the trees. When they sprout leaves, you can see for yourselves and know that summer is near. Even so, when you see these things happening, you know that the kingdom of God is near. Commentary

Advent, from the Latin *Adventus* (coming) is a season that begins on the 4th Sunday before Christmas day and marks the beginning of the church liturgical year. The colour for Advent is purple, which happens to be my favourite colour! There is a richness to the colour purple, which was traditionally a colour associated with royalty, probably due to the expense of the dye required to create it. Liturgically purple signifies that something serious is taking place, Lent and Advent are both times of preparation, of looking forward to a momentous event, yet there is also a sense of solemnity to it and it is also the colour of mourning, often associated with funerals.

There are numerous traditions associated with this season, for example; Advent Crowns, rings and bridges. In our churches we follow the practice of lighting a candle each week, marking four themes of Advent, which are simply Love, Hope, Peace and Joy. Those of you around my age, or who have children who are, will probably remember the famous Blue Peter advent ring, and may actually have tried to make one out of coat hangers and tinsel! Putnoe, along with many other churches, has a travelling nativity that visits household members and church groups, attempting to help people feel 'part of something'. Then there are Advent calendars, often with a 'treat' each day, and Advent candles, with sections to burn each day, which risk turning Advent into a simple 'countdown to Christmas', rather than a season in its own right.

While Advent is indeed about preparing for Christmas; when we meet the infant Christ once more, it is also a time to recall that Christ promised to come again, while remembering that God is already with us, always, and to the end of the age.

There is, undoubtedly, a special quality about waiting for something to happen (a reunion, a needed holiday, new opportunities, a new child etc.) yet it is important that we do not let this focus on a future event wipe out the value of the present. As God's people we are called to look forward to the Kingdom while recognising the value of today, to celebrate what is good, while looking again prayerfully at that which troubles us.

In recent years some people have rejected a Church that can appear more concerned with the future than the present. I find this very sad, because this is the opposite of what I believe Jesus requires of us. If we are indeed called to be 'Children of God', or 'Co-creators with Christ', we must experience God in the present, in every person and situation we meet. Too often, even His Church, walks by without realising we just missed the people God is working in and through.

Yes, Advent is a time of watching and waiting, but this does not mean we are to stand around 'impotently' waiting for Jesus to arrive and sort it all out.

Signs of the Kingdom

Signs are everywhere if we know how to read them, road signs are intended to both alert us to potential dangers and to remind us of things we know, like the speed limit, and encourage us to check our behaviour. Even within nature we are accustomed to signs, some more reliable than others, some examples;

- Cows sitting down = expect rain,
- 'Red sky at night' = expect a good night/ 'red sky in the morning' = expect rough weather,
- The first Cuckoo or the first snowdrops are seen to herald the coming of spring,
- Lots of berries = expect a hard winter.
- Hurting joints/wounds = expect cold/wet weather

At times like this, with all the horrifying acts of terror, wars and natural disasters we see, it can be uncomfortable reading some of the apocalyptic prophecies. Yet, in the Gospel reading today, Jesus warns us that we should "Be careful, or your hearts will be weighed down with dissipation, drunkenness and the anxieties of life, and that day will close on you unexpectedly like a trap."

Sound familiar? There has been much talk this week about the dangers of 'over sharing', especially in regards to children becoming unnecessarily concerned about the dangers of terrorism. I have long been aware that there is a tendency for those who cannot get out of their house to watch a lot of TV, especially the BBC it would appear for an older generation, who still feel that this is public service programming. I first became aware that some people are watching BBC 24 news for hour after hour in the daytime – no wonder they often become scared of going out!

More recently I have become aware of the detrimental effect of some daytime viewing on people with dementia, how programmes about 'rogue traders', 'cowboy builders' and burglary can easily become confused with life, and I have seen people convinced it is them that have been defrauded. We need to be aware of the risks, but we risk focussing on the potential dangers and actually failing to live. There is a common conception that the world is much more dangerous that it once was, yet I heard a man on the radio who had been injured when the IRA bombed Harrods in 1984 compel people to carry on with their lives. After all, I had a wonderfully free childhood, despite growing up in Sheffield while police were searching for Peter Sutcliffe (The Yorkshire Ripper).

Our society is at risk of focussing only on the negatives, so perhaps this is the very situation that Jesus' warning about not letting our hearts be weighed down by anxieties can speak into today? If I could do one thing to change how many people now see this time of year it would be to remove the panic and stress! I would dearly love to refocus some priorities away from 'the perfect Christmas Meal' or 'The perfect Christmas gift' back to those four simple words that are represented by our advent candles. For if everyone could truly focus on Love, Hope, Joy and Peace, would anything else actually matter?

There is a sense in which the act of preparation and looking ahead is a privilege reserved only for those who can afford to do so. A persons' priorities depend on their needs, if you are thirsty that is your primary concern, once you have water the next need is food, then shelter and community etc. Only when all of these basic needs are met can a person start to plan ahead, beyond the next meal.

What are we to do with this gift of preparation then? Given the opportunity to plan perhaps it is time to review our own priorities, and why it is we believe them to be so important. We can ask ourselves if we are actually ready for the coming of Jesus, by reflecting on the question If He were to appear, here, this year and walk the streets of our community, would we be happy with what he would see?

Perhaps if you do have an advent calendar this year maybe each day, as you open a new door, you can think of it as an opportunity to draw closer to God, to remove any personal barriers, let down your defences and dare to Love, and be loved. *Deacon Jane Mills*
