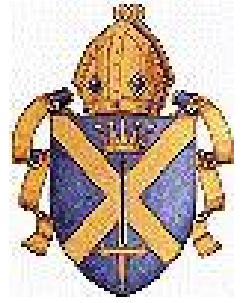

First Reading – Proverbs 8: 1-4, 22-31

Does not wisdom call out? Does not understanding raise her voice? On the heights along the way, where the paths meet, she takes her stand; beside the gates leading into the city, at the entrances, she cries aloud: "To you, O men, I call out; I raise my voice to all mankind. "The LORD brought me forth as the first of his works, before his deeds of old; I was appointed from eternity, from the beginning, before the world began. When there were no oceans, I was given birth, when there were no springs abounding with water; before the mountains were settled in place, before the hills, I was given birth, before he made the earth or its fields or any of the dust of the world. I was there when he set the heavens in place, when he marked out the horizon on the face of the deep, when he established the clouds above and fixed securely the fountains of the deep, when he gave the sea its boundary so the waters would not overstep his command, and when he marked out the foundations of the earth. Then I was the craftsman at his side. I was filled with delight day after day, rejoicing always in his presence, rejoicing in his whole world and delighting in mankind

Second Reading – Romans 5: 1-5

Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we rejoice in the hope of the glory of God. Not only so, but we also rejoice in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope. And hope does not disappoint us, because God has poured out his love into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, whom he has given us.

(Reader: This is the Word of the Lord. **All: Thanks be to God**)

Gospel Reading – John 16: 12 –15 - Glory to Christ our Saviour

I have much more to say to you, more than you can now bear. But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all truth. He will not speak on his own; he will speak only what he hears, and he will tell you what is yet to come. He will bring glory to me by taking from what is mine and making it known to you. All that belongs to the Father is mine. That is why I said the Spirit will take from what is mine and make it known to you.

(Reader: This is the Gospel of Christ. **All: Praise to Christ our Lord**)

Commentary

Today is Trinity Sunday, which has been observed by the church on this Sunday, the first Sunday after Pentecost, in the West since the tenth century and was adopted officially in Rome in 1334.

The Trinity is in the centre of our Christian belief, yet most of us would have great difficulty beginning to explain what it means. Karl Rahner, an influential theologian, said that we could dispense with the doctrine of the Trinity as false and the major part of religious literature could well remain virtually unchanged. I would very much like to get rid of the doctrine of the Trinity, this is not a word which we find in the Bible. However we do need to keep on explaining the fact that God has revealed himself in three different ways, he is not just the old man on the cloud. We have a God who in the person of Jesus walked and talked, lived and died with us and shared all that we are. Last Sunday we were also reminded that at Pentecost God became known to the disciples in the Holy Spirit, and it is through the work of the Holy Spirit today that we are able to say that 'Jesus is Lord.' So needing a way to express this, we end up with the Trinity.

It is well-known that the doctrine of the Trinity does not appear in the Scriptures, and that it has been contested from time to time by various Christian thinkers. The definitive formulations of the Trinity are found in the creeds agreed upon at the First Council of Nicea (in 325 AD) and the Council of Constantinople (in 381 AD). Those statements were composed to combat specific opposing opinions and naturally drew upon the linguistic and philosophical resources available to Greek-speaking communities at the time. The intention of the creeds was to affirm core beliefs in the face of specific opposition to — the unity of God, the complete humanity and essential divinity of Jesus and the divinity of the Spirit.

So we have this Sunday an occasion which sums up all that has gone before in the church calendar which leads us to these realities about God. We have seen the major events the birth, death, resurrection and ascension--and the demonstration of the power of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, the church now tries to put these things together, and we have come up with the old theological relic, the Trinity.

Every year preachers across the world come up with corny examples to try and explain how God can be three Gods and one God at the same time. Most of their attempts would have been sufficient to have them killed as heretics in earlier times. The problem we have can be clearly seen when we express in a mathematical formula what the Trinity proposes $1+1+1 = 1$. This is undoubtedly absurd, and no amount of explanation will work adequately. The doctrine of the Trinity is a stumbling block for many, how can God be three and one at the same time ? It is a vain attempt to put into words the fact that God is the Giver of life as creator, shares our life as Jesus our saviour and empowers our life today as Holy Spirit.

Some people will find the whole thing a barren wilderness. Some will find the language we use when we speak of Trinity as positively unhelpful. For example we use such male language for God, many would want to incorporate other images which point to a broader understanding of God as the mother of all that is. We have to accept that when we try and contain God within our language, words are just insufficient.

However surely this is true of so many things, which one of us can understand the doctrine of atonement, do we dare to imagine that we can make sense of doctrines of free will, of predestination, of suffering or how an all powerful God can seem so powerless?

In this respect the Trinity is little different from everything we believe as Christians, our faith is not about what we know, or understand, it is about opening our hearts and minds to the presence of God. Accepting that the word Trinity has many limitations, but is still very important, let's think a little more about it. We baptise in the name of the Trinity, it is a sign of orthodoxy - adherence to good belief.

Trinity guides our faith in -

1. God as Father It means that we recognise the transcendence of God, his majesty or other wordliness. We see in God a holiness which means that he is affronted by human sin. It is no use pointing the self righteous finger at others we are all exposed by God's holiness.

2. God the Son Yet we also have begun, through the life of Jesus to understand a little of the fact that God is love. Forget all of the theology which tries to explain things like substitutionary atonement. In the life of Jesus we see God in human form and he approaches the weak and lost and forgives them instantly of their

sin and offers them new life, even before he has died.

3. God the Holy Spirit We have embarked upon a journey of discovery. Recognising our complete inability to comprehend God, we have nevertheless opened our lives to draw close to God and have experienced something of the reality of God's life in our lives. This is what all of this language in John 3 is about when it speaks of being born from above, or born anew.

Put this together and you are left with a Christian Trinity, but Trinity Sunday is not a day for theological conundrums. It is a day in which looking at God we learn something about ourselves and this affects us and changes us. Following Trinity Sunday we now have many weeks of Ordinary Sundays when we will wear green and get on with living our Christian lives without fanfare, we have left behind us the special festivals of Christmas, Easter, Pentecost. From now on the Sunday readings will encourage us to live changed lives, to be 'born again' transformed by God's Spirit. *Charles Royden*

Meditation We generally do a poor job of resting in the mysterious. There's something about the unknown that makes us uncomfortable. Yet, in the mysterious there lies something beautiful, something beyond our reach, something that knows us and knows all things far better than we ever could. It is in that mystery that we live, and move, and have our being.

Albert Einstein wrote: *The most beautiful and deepest experience a man can have is the sense of the mysterious. It is the underlying principle of religion as well as all serious endeavour in art and science. He who never had this experience seems to me, if not dead, then at least blind. To sense that behind anything that can be experienced there is a something that our mind cannot grasp and whose beauty and sublimity reaches us only indirectly and as a feeble reflection, this is religiousness. In this sense I am religious. To me it suffices to wonder at these secrets and to attempt humbly to grasp with my mind a mere image of the lofty structure of all that there is. (The World As I See It)*

The Apostle Paul famously wrote, "For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known." It's a beautiful way of expressing the limits of our human understanding, particularly when speaking of God. There's a point at which we must simply resign ourselves to the fact that we aren't meant to understand all things. In the gospel text from John 16 today, Jesus tells his disciples, "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now." How difficult that is for us to hear! There is still truth to be revealed, but we are not ready to hear it! We must simply be content to live in the tension between the "already" and the "not yet". The reality of God in Jesus Christ has already come to us, but the fullness of God's kingdom is not yet to be. So too, our understanding of God is left knocking at the door of mystery, but for now the door remains closed to us.

Prayers for Sunday and the Week Ahead

God as Creator. As Christians we cannot believe that the world was the work of anybody other than our God. We look at it and it is marvellous and we believe that God made it. But it is more than a belief in some thing which we read. When we look at creation we feel God and his creating power.

Prayer Today we give thanks to God our Creator. Thank you God that you have made all things and made them well That you have given to us all things richly to enjoy For the beauty and the bounty of this fair earth and for the creating power alive in this universe which make all things new. For this we thank you God. But forgive us when in pride, or selfishness or anger we misuse your gifts

God as Jesus who died for us. We read about Jesus but when we read the story it isn't just a story, it comes across to us as powerfully as if it happened yesterday. We read that Jesus lived and walked this earth, we are coming up to the end of the millennium when we will remember the history of his birth, but there is more than that, we feel the life of Christ today, we seek daily to bear his cross and to live his risen life -

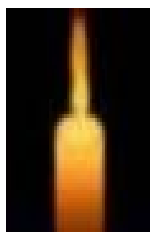
